NIKOLA PAŠIĆ IN ST. PETERSBURG DURING THE ANNEXATION CRISIS IN 1908

Annexation Crisis (Bosnian Crisis) represents one of the most dramatic events in the recent history of Serbia. In October 1908 the Austro-Hungarian Empire violated the international law annexed Bosnia and Hercegovina. Serbian population and Serbian national interests were jeopardized. As a response, Serbian government and its minister of foreign affairs, Milovan Milovanović began an energetic diplomacy in order to influence the Great Powers towards the most favorable solution for Serbia. One of the negotiators was Nikola Pašić, whose duty was to express Serbian stance in St. Petersburg.
