The Work of Stanoje Stojanović in Editing the Ranke's Proceedings

The paper tries to illuminate an example from the development of our historiography. The introduction deals with some of the main characteristics of the long-term development of the Serbian history science. It is difficult to estimate how much the work of Leopold Ranke about Serbia of the 19th century was important for the development of the Serbian history science. However, there has always been a great amount of interests for his work. Stanoje Stanojević, who appreciated the work of L. Ranke, on the fiftieth anniversary of Ranke's death, in 1936, initiated in the Serbian Academy of Science the publishing of the Proceedings in his honour. Furthermore, the paper discusses the unpublished documents from *The Archive of the Serbian Academy of Science* which followed the Proceedings publishing preparations. These documents make an interesting record of the cultural past, since they contain the names of a great number of scientists, as well as the titles of the papers planned for publishing. Some of these papers were published and they represent an important contribution to the Serbian historiography, while the majority of them were not, due to the death of Stanoje Stanojević in 1937. Further, the author of this paper examines the contribution of these scientists to the issues concerning the First Serbian Uprising, on the basis of the basic historiography data about these scientists. The author explores the assumptions that some of their papers were published afterwards, according to the investigation of their bibliography.
