Summary

The Higher Women's Private School in Niš (1906-1914) – the School History through the Book of Records

By the King's decree dated August 21st 1904, and with the approval of the Minister of Education, and the parents' agreement on August 26th 1904, the first Higher Women's Private School was founded. At those times, the Higher Women's Private School had four grades. The decision to enlarge the number of grades to five was made by the Minister of Education by the Act dated September 13th 1905. By the Act of the Minister of Education dated October 2nd 1904, the school was to be managed by a Principal, whereas the owner and the School Board were to look after the finacial support, and soon, on December 4th 1905, there came the proposal for foundation of the "Charity Fund for the poor students of the Higher Women's School in Niš", which was accepted. The Fund regulations were approved by the Minister, on November 11th 1906. By the King's decree dated July 23rd 1906, the school was transformed into the Private women's grammar school. In the year of 1912, the school became a seven-grade one, while in the period of 1913-1914, it went back to a sixgrade education. In the academic year of 1913/1914, the coeducation was being carried out in the Niš grammar school, and this is the year when the coeducational school was founded, named Serbian Royal Grammar School in Niš.
